Do you remember the timeless children's story by Watty Piper (aka Arnold Munk) about a little blue engine who successfully pulled a long, heavy train carrying Christmas toys over a high mountain , chugging all the way up "I think I can, I think I can, I think I can..."? RioVision and the good people of our town often remind me of that little engine.

We have been keeping you updated on one good example of people coming together with "I can" on their minds: the Riverview School Garden Project (nicknamed "Riverview Farms"). RioVision volunteers constructed the 12 large planter boxes and filled them with topsoil. The school's first crop is thriving under the care of Riverview students with the support of school admin, faculty, and parents. Additional funding is needed to build a tool shed and fill it with tools, and for the school curriculum that will support the garden in years to come. On September 5<sup>th</sup> to support this project, Riverview Middle School launched a one month fundraising event to raise the \$1668 needed by October 6<sup>th</sup> to match a grant from the Healthy Planet organization. Or you can bring a check or cash to the school office at 525 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. Can we do it, Rio Vista? I think we can.

We can also feed the hungry in our community by supporting Rio Vista Food Pantry's donation drive for their October Rummage Sale fundraiser during Bass Festival weekend. They accept donations at 45 Main Street from 5:30-7:30pm on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays through 10/4 and on Saturdays from 11am-3pm (except 9/23). Books, clothing, electronics, mattresses, sheets, pillowcases, and large exercise equipment are excluded. With RioVision, The Flamingo downtown held a fundraiser on September 9<sup>th</sup> to refurbish their iconic neon sign and light up the night again on Main Street. Outdoor tables and chairs have also been ordered for the "patio areas" outside The Pizza Factory and Rio Vista Market to allow downtown visitors, day or night, to enjoy our river-fresh air.
