"10-4" is one of many "ten- codes or signals" developed in the late 1930s by Public Safety Communication officials to make law enforcement radio messaging more efficient (no longer in routine use). The standard "10-" preceding the code number was to cover a brief delay in powering up the radio transmitter when the microphone button was pushed, so that the second number could be clearly received. "10-4" translates as "understood, yes-acknowledged, affirmative, I heard you" similar to 'copy' in the military and 'roger' among pilots. Listening to our community – its citizens, visitors, businesses, organizations, volunteers, and artists – are important to us at RioVision. We hope that what we do communicates a "10-4" – we have heard you, your message has been received. When you volunteer your time or donate your resources, you give a "10-4" back to us.
