**COVER**: Through the artistry of Assistant Editor Jan Vick, our new sheep art installations take a stroll along the promenade before settling into their new digs on Main Street.


The long-awaited flock of sheep are now gracing Rio Vista at the corner of Main and Front Streets and at the flood wall at the end of Main in front of City Hall. The flock consists of three ewes (named Picassewe, Sassy and Pastel Skies), one lamb (Skittles) and a ram (Rammy). The ram is the Rio Vista High School whose mascot. This very colorful collection is a joint project of the City of Rio Vista and Rio Vision's City Art Program (CAP) committee. One of RioVision's earliest projects was working with city staff to create a public art ordinance,

Local artists recruited by RioVision completed the artwork, so each of the sheep is very unique. The artists who donated their time and creative talent are: Ellen LaVaccare (Picassewe), Diana Pierce (Sassy), Julie Jacobs (Skittles), Scarlett Dole (Pastel Skies) and Harvey Weinhaus (Rammy).

Ellen is an experienced artist who works with acrylic, oil and watercolor. She noted that painting the ewe was especially challenging because of the very bumpy surface, meant to simulate a sheep's coat, but a real challenge for a painter. Despite these challenges, the artists have each

which was adopted in 2014. The resulting public art fund has been growing with each new development. This project is the first use of this fund, which went to purchase sheep from Cowpainters, a manufacturer of fiberglass animals of all kinds. The city has a number of murals created in recent years and a wind sculpture in the Promenade Park. The flock is the first life-sized animal themed art installation for the city. It brings lots of color, as well as the hope that more public art follows.

created very striking and highly decorative sculptures that highlight the long history of sheep ranching in the Rio Vista area.

Each sheep is accompanied with signage about the artists and has a QR code where more detailed information on the piece and that artist may be found along with an admonition to please not sit or climb on the sheep no matter how tempting that may be!

# Delta Roots

Six Hands Winery, southwest of Walnut Grove on Isleton Road, has been making wine in the Delta for 100 years. Joseph Machado, great-great grandfather to Peter Marks, began farming in Walnut Grove, and started making wine as well as growing other crops, such as cherries. Peter Marks learned wine making from his maternal grandfather and ultimately

obtained a degree in plant sciences from UC Davis. His wife, Richele has a degree in genetics. In 1997, Peter, Richele and his father Norman Marks decided to create a winery on the family farm; thus, the Six Hands. But the entire extended family is deeply involved in the entire process of producing delicious hand-crafted wines.

Six Hands Winery is committed to sustainable farming: finding the right balance without pesticides and minimal herbicides. Cover crops are mowed during the growing season to maintain soil moisture levels. They recycle Six Hands is a family-owned and operated vineyard in the Clarksburg American Viticultural Area (AVA). The home vineyard produces three estate wines: Syrah, Viognier, and Ranch Rosé. Other grapes are sourced from local vineyards: Cusumano Ranch in Lodi for Zinfandel grapes; Cresci Vineyard in Lodi for Chenin Blanc, Cabernet Sauvignon,

and Petit Syrah; Heringer Holland Vineyard in Clarksburg for Chardonnay and Petite Syrah; the Yolo Vineyards in Dunnigan Hills for Albariño, Sauvignon Blanc, Grenache and Merlot; various vineyards in Healdsburg for Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier used for the sparkling wine Célébration. All are processed at the winery in Walnut Grove.

The wines are available at a variety of wine shops and restaurants or online at www.sixhandswinery.com. The winery opens its doors several times a year for events for club members and the public. They are





grape must (unfermented juice extracted by crushing or pressing, stems, etc.), into compost for the vines. All work in the vineyard is done by hand. They also mulch vine cuttings. Six Hands uses a timed drip system to preserve our precious water, and all harvesting is done by hand. Solar panels power the entire winery. This makes for a biodiversity that supports not only the vines, but a home for rabbits, coyotes, owls and hawks.

Often the entire Marks family is there to greet you, discuss wines, harvests, growing and whatever you want to know. This year, the summer picnic offered wine tasting and sales, cheese plates for sale, shaded tables for a picnic and a dixieland jazz band for entertainment. 

# The First

This October the City of Rio Vista and the Chamber of Commerce host yet another Bass Festival. But just how did this event get started? The idea of a "Derby" originated with two newspapermen, Phil Rose of Redwood City and Harry Proctor of Oakland. They had the idea of holding a bass derby at Rio



That evening, a committee was appointed of local citizens including C. Flodin, A. Wood, George Gordon, W. Dawley and E. Egbert. Appointed to the position of General Chairman was W. Godsell, the Rio Vista Chief of Police, while Fred Christensen was appointed Chairman. However, Phil Rose and Harry Proctor were known as the directing heads of the contest.

George Augusto and George C. Gordon would manage the job of registration and fish weigh-ins. W. Dawley oversaw landing floats, while A. Wood took care of yacht landings. P. Jacobs, local school principal, and W. Godsell took care of the entertainment, while decorations were under the supervision of E. Egbert. Tom King had the duty of putting up colorful banners around town. The local volunteer firemen and American Legion members would address the parking situation, while the local Boy Scouts of America troop oversaw policing the streets about town. The Rio Vista Fire House on Main Street

Commerce President E. Egbert to former

U. S. President Herbert Hoover, Governor James Rolph Jr., and Will Rogers, asking that they attend the festivities as special guests. Governor Rolph replied, unfortunately he could not attend, as he would be in the southern part of the state. A telegram was also received from Will Rogers, saying that he

appreciated the invitation, but was working on a picture and could not possibly get away.

Prizes were gathered from businesses in the Bay Area totaling more than \$2,000. The prizes were as follows:

First Prize: 1933 Elto trolling motor (\$104); Gold Watch (\$100); \$50 Cash; Montague "Bambex" (\$20).

Second Prize: There was one prize for women and one for men. Gold Watch (\$50); \$25 Cash.

Third Prize: Fishing skiff (\$37.50); Primo Cuttyhunk line (\$1.50); "Robs" sinkers, (\$1.00); One dozen "MacRose" steelhead flies (\$2.00).

Fourth Prize: Winston custom-built rod (\$37.50); 150 yards of Primo Cuttyhunk line (\$1.50).

Fifth Prize: Winston Rod, choice of surf, trout or bass (\$37.50).

Sixth Prize: "Tarzan" Triple Twist two pants suit (\$28.50).

Seventh Prize: "Ike" Walton reel, 300 yards (25.00); Primo Cuttyhunk

Eight Prize: "Norca" reel, a Pilueger reel (\$12.50); Primo Cuttvhunk line, 150 yards (\$1.50); "Robs" Sinkers (\$1.00).

Ninth Prize: Complete bass outfit, rod, reel, line, hooks, sinkers, and

Tenth Prize: Fishing Rod (5.00); Primo Cuttyhunk line, 150 yards (\$1.00); "Robs" Sinkers (\$1.00).

Ladies Largest Fish: One Boston Fern, eight feet in diameter (\$20.00).

### December 10, 1933 – First Annual Rio Vista **Striped Bass Derby Semi-Finals**

More than thirteen hundred fishermen registered for the three and a half hour semi-finals. The entire area was covered with a thick blanket of fog. One fisherman was quoted with the following description of the fog's effect on the event, "I thought I had the river all to myself until the fog lifted in the afternoon, and I found myself in the midst of about 100 boats."

More than two hundred and twenty people brought in catches weighing five pounds or more. An Alameda resident brought in the largest fish of the day weighing 29½ pounds.

Representatives of Paramount, Fox and Hearst covered the event and Universal filmed newsreel footage. Reporters and photographers were present from International News Services, Associated Press, as well as San Francisco Chronicle and Oakland Tribune feature writers.


#### December 17, 1933 – First Annual Rio Vista Striped Bass Derby Finals

The one hundred fishermen catching the largest fish took part in the finals of the Derby. As usual for December, conditions were not the best – both fog and muddy waters existed. Rotaro Nakamura of Woodland caught the winning fish weighing 8 pounds. Gertie Hoag of Davis was the lone winner of the Ladies Prize with a catch weighing 6 pounds 8 ounces.

#### The Derby Returns in 1949

The derby continued annually until 1939 when the decision was made to drop the event. One of the reasons for the decision was the war in Europe.

In 1949, local merchant, Romildo "Braid" Pezzaglia had the idea to revive the event, and it has been held, for the most part, every year since.

What has striped bass, cash prizes, food and craft vendors, a parade, fireworks, a classic car show, a pancake breakfast, a beer garden, a carnival, a rummage sale, and ten bands performing over three days?

If you guessed the 74th Annual Rio Vista Bass Derby & Festival, you are correct! And it all takes place October 7, 8, and 9 in downtown Rio Vista.

The Rio Vista Bass Derby & Festival is the longest running fishing derby on the west coast. First held in 1933, it continued each year until 1938 and was discontinued from 1939-1949, most likely due to the war in Europe. It has been held almost every year since.

The fishing derby has three categories: Striped Bass, Sturgeon, and Salmon. Cash prizes are awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishes in each category. Top prize for striped bass is \$3,000. In addition to the cash prizes, there are fishing/camping/ outdoor gear prizes to be awarded to those placing beyond the first three places. There is also a kids' fishing derby with cash prizes for catfish and fishing gear for those placing beyond third place.

The fishing derby runs from 6:00 am Friday, October 7 until 3:00 pm Sunday, October 9. Winners are announced at the weigh station at the foot of Main St. shortly after 3:00 pm with prizes awarded immediately after. Thank you to Ken Baccetti and the Striped Bass Association (Isleton Chapter) for their help in planning the fishing derby and for their operation of the weigh station at the foot of Main St.

While the fishing derby is taking place, there is an enormous festival going on in downtown Rio Vista for three fun-filled days. An estimated 15,000-20,000 people attend the festival over the three-day period. Special thanks go to Rio Vista Farms/CoCo Farms, our Diamond Corporate sponsor for the festival.

At 45 Main St., the Rio Vista Food Pantry hosts the very popular "Catch of the Day" rummage sale. Snap up a variety of gently used items for sale throughout the weekend.

Front St. comes alive with almost 100 vendors selling a variety of food, drinks, desserts, arts and crafts, and all manner of homemade goodies. Several informational tables represent various non-profits and businesses.



The Western Express Railroad train operates Saturday and Sunday, transporting festival goers up and down Main and Front Streets. Hop on board and rest your feet while moving from activity to activity and enjoy the sights and sounds of the music, carnival, car show, and more.

Relax and enjoy ice-cold beer, wine, margaritas, and delicious food items under a huge tent with plenty of tables and chairs at the Pole Barn on Front St. You'll also find the Starlight Stage where ten bands perform over the three days of the festival. Sit back and enjoy the music or put your dancin' shoes on and join in the fun. Bands scheduled to perform include:

Network, Groovy Judy, and Livin' Daylites — Friday, October 7, 4:00-11:00 pm River Ratz, Derek Abel Band, Strange Brew, and Briefcase Blues Brothers — Saturday, October 8, 11:30 am-11:00 pm

Michelle Lambert, Afterglow, and Angela Street — Sunday, October 9,

Karaoke performances take place during band breaks.

This year, we celebrate the return of the carnival, and our festival is back to full-tilt fun on Front St. Last year's carnival fell victim to the pandemic's effects on carnival staff availability where there were not enough workers to go around. Larger carnival rides are located on the west side of Front St. and rides for little ones are located across the street on the river side. Nab discount tickets in advance. The tickets may be exchanged at the carnival ticket booth for an allday wristband for one person or for a package of several ride tickets that may be shared. Get ready to spin, drop, and zoom through the rides and attractions. Welcome back carnival!

Saturday begins with a Pancake Breakfast, hosted by the Rio Vista Lions and the Rio Vista Hot Shots, at the RVFD Fire Station. The Rio Vista Lions also host a classic car show on Main St. Judging of the car entries takes place during the day and prizes are awarded at 3:00 pm.

Saturday evening features a spectacular fireworks show over the river at approximately 8:45 pm. We thank The Dutra Group for donating use of their barge to stage the fireworks and Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery who sponsors this event.

Sunday features a good old-fashioned small-town parade that begins at noon. A variety of groups, non-profits and businesses gather near 7th St. to begin the march down Main St.

An enormous thank you to all the volunteers who put this event together and for the contributions by sponsors and Chamber members. And a special thank you to the City of Rio Vista who partners with the Chamber to plan and bring this event to fruition.



#### **Travis Air Force Base Aero Club**

The Travis Air Force Base Aero Club is a flight school that has been at the Rio Vista Municipal Airport since 2006. Offering flight training, plane rentals, aviation instruction, and discovery flights, the Aero Club's mission is to make aviation educational, memorable, and inspiring.

The Discovery Flight is a great introduction to aviation for up to three people for \$240/hour. **Participants** receive general information from the pilot about how to fly a plane and how the cockpit controls work. Participants actually fill out a flight plan, review the pre-flight check list, become familiarized with the instrument panel and switch the toggle switches on and off as instructed.

Once in the air the flight instructor helps participants navigate by pressing the right and left rudder pedals. Flights typically cover the East Bay or the Delta. The views are magnificent!

The Aero Club provides an excellent educational and aviation experience. It offers training for Private Pilot, Instrument Rating, Commercial Pilot, Certified Instructor, and Certified Flight Instructor-Instrument. They also offer online private pilot ground school. In addition, the school is getting a new full motion flight simulator. Rates are extremely competitive

with other facilities in the area. Once an individual receives their license, they then can rent the Aero Club's airplanes for recreational flying.

In 2019 the school was the winner of the "Flight Training Experience Award" by the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association. Involved in aviation since 1977, Dan Saran is the Aero Club manager. Dan earned his private pilot license and Instrument Flight Rules rating but chose to pursue a career with a

Bay Area fire department, although he stayed involved with aviation both professionally and as a hobby. Lucia Sanchez is the office manager for the past seven years and has been an invaluable team member.

### **Aero Club Flight Instructors**

The flight school instructors are highly trained with years of experience.

Ira Billick is the club's chief flight instructor. Instructing student pilots since 1974, he has accumulated 16,400 flying hours. After completing his years of service as a Army pilot, Ira "dedicated his life's mission to teach the art of flying and piloting an aircraft."

Capt. R. Ernest Templeton, (Retired) has earned accreditation as a NAFI (National Association of Flight Instructors) Master Flight Instructor. Ernest has enjoyed working as a flight instructor for the past eight years.

Matt Grossen is skilled in multi-engine, turbine, high performance, and complex planes. Also a retired Air Force pilot instructor, Matt strives to give the best training possible in good flying habits, techniques, and decision making.

John Yeckel is a first officer at a regional airline and a retired Air Force instructor. He has over fifteen years of instructor experience. John received a Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautics in 2016 and has completed his Instrument, Commercial, and Flight Instructor pilot rating at the Travis AFB Aero Club.

> Ed McGaha runs the flight simulator and flies with students.

John Howard is retired from the Air Force and has been a commercial pilot. He started flying when he was sixteen years old at a local Air Force Aero Club. Ed has accumulated nearly 5,000 flight hours and has been teaching for more than six years.

images. Much of this work is traditional photography, however, a portion of his catalog consists of photo-digital art pieces. These pieces combine traditional photographs with digital painting. They


maintain the detail and clarity of the original photograph with a painted feel suggestive of watercolor or pastel chalk art.






